Hi Jonathan!

We have a few options for you. One is that we do have both the stencils and the curb markers available if you'd like to mark the drain in question and even surrounding areas. The stencil says "Dump No Waste, Drains to Waterway" and is approximately the size of the drain grate. You would spray paint the stencil onto the street or curb next to the drain. We also have 4 inch plastic curb markers that say "Dump No Waste, Drains to Lake Michigan" (see attached image). I would be happy to come and bring you either the stencil or some curb markers and adhesive for you to use in that neighborhood. Our pet waste brochure is a little out of date – We've been meaning to update it, so if you like what you see and want us to get you a newer version, let me know. Sounds like bagging the waste isn't the problem, but we do have lots of pet waste bag dispensers that have the attached info on them. I'd be happy to drop those off in your office as well if you need them.

Correct?

Lower Grand River Watershed Dogs for the Environment

Responsible pet ownership

Bring a responsible pet owner means more than just licensing and vaccinating your pet, it means controlling your dogs' interactions with people, wildlife, and natural areas. Here are some actions you and your dog can take to keep our beautiful Watershed clean, green, and safe.

Scoop the poop

Dog poop is essentially raw sewage; it contains harmful organisms like *E. coli, Leptospira*, and Roundworms. These organisms can be contracted by other dogs, wildlife, and even children. Bacteria from dog poop can wash into rivers and streams when it rains. Many municipal codes also require that all poop must be picked up and disposed of into the proper receptacle.

Leash your dog

While your dog is your friendly, furry companion, other animals and even people may view dogs as a threat. Unleashed dogs can harm birds, amphibians, fish, and other wildlife. They may also disturb breeding areas or harass wintering wildlife causing them to use valuable energy reserves. Dogs running loose in natural parks also trample plants and create inappropriate trails. Worse, they can endanger themselves, other dogs, and people. Many municipalities

> require that all dogs in parks must be kept on a leash unless in a designated off-leash area.
