Staff of the Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE), Water Resources Division (WRD), Grand Rapids District Office (GRDO) conducted a desk audit and inspection of the City of Ferrysburg's (City) MS4 program on July 28, 2021. The purpose of the evaluation was to determine compliance with Part 31, Water Resources Protection, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended; and the NPDES MS4 Watershed Based General Permit No. MIG619000 and the City's COC No. MIG610212.

This audit included a comprehensive review of the City's documented implementation of its MS4 Storm Water Management Program (SWMP) and a site inspection of the City's Public Works Garage and Fire Barn. As part of the audit, implementation of the following minimum control measures was evaluated: public education program (PEP), illicit discharge elimination program (IDEP), pollution prevention/good housekeeping program. The audit was based on the review of the following information:

- Progress reports dated 2017, 2019
- Prior on-site inspections/audits (2012)
- On-site inspection and conversation with permittee

The City participates in and receives MS4 program support from the Lower Grand River Organization of Watersheds. The City distributes PEP materials in media, print and public events. Employees have received appropriate MS4-related training. Illicit discharges are addressed in a timely and appropriate manner. The Public Works Garage floor drains are currently discharging to a sub-surface drainfield. The floor drains are exposed to vehicle washing and vehicle maintenance. City staff indicated that there is a plan in place to re-route this discharge to public sanitary sewer. In the meantime, care should be taken to minimize the amount of run-off entering the floor drain. Outdoor vehicle washing where runoff will discharge to the ground surface is encouraged during this transition. Similarly, vehicle wash water from the fire barn should be directed to the ground surface and cleaning agents should be re-evaluated to ensure that they meet the restrictions of groundwater discharge rules.

The City of Ferrysburg appears to be meeting the requirements of COC No. MIG610212.
