Section 74-355 of Sparta Village Code of Ordinances prohibits the discharge of any substance to a water body, directly or indirectly, other than stormwater or an exempted discharge. Section 74-356 outlines discharges that are exempted from this ordinance. I have attached a copy of both ordinances for your reference.

Please note that saltwater pools are never permitted to be discharged into the storm drain. If you wish to discharge water from your property, please be sure it is an exempted discharge outlined in Section 74-356. If you are discharging water off your property and it is not an exempted discharge, you will be fined for violating the Sparta Village Code of Ordinances.

Below I have outlined two potential solutions to legally discharge water from your saltwater pool. You may choose one or utilize a combination of the two options below:

- 1) You may discharge your pool backwash to a grassy area on your property, so long as the discharge does not leave the property;
- 2) You may discharge your pool backwash to the sanitary system, if feasible.
