There's More! New Testing Kit

We recently received a backpack full of testing supplies and equipment to start better tracking Coldbrook Creek water quality! Included are tests for conductivity, dissolved oxygen, nitrate and phosphate, pH, and turbidity. There is also a way to report the information we gather to an online database. This is a great citizen science opportunity!

A big thanks to LGROW, as they were able to piggyback us on a project from Central Michigan University to get this kit to us.
