# Did you know...

...that the mouth of Coldbrook Creek, near Canal Park on Monroe, has a bit of history?

The area was once much more difficult to traverse than it is today. According to C.C. Chapman's "History of Kent County", the area north of Pearl was "somewhat marshy, kept wet by the springs from the hills above". However, nearer to the creek and inland a bit was a "sand bluff as steep as the sand would lie...descending by a nearly uniform slope to Coldbrook".

The mouth of the creek was also the sight of a violent crime, perhaps reflective of the struggle to settle the area. Treaties with the federal government proved controversial for members of the local Ottawa, some working with early settlers, some not. Per treaty conditions, stipends to tribe members took place in Grand Rapids, thus many converged along the river periodically. According to an historical article from the GR Press dated 8-13-1901, on one such occasion "a guarrel over the treaty" broke out between Chief Kewaycoosheum and Wasogenaw. The chief ended up dead, "the scene of the crime was near the mouth of Coldbrook creek."

Ah, if the mouth of Coldbrook Creek could talk.

## Wege Grant Update

As you may recall, the Coldbrook Creek Community (through the assistance of <u>LGROW</u>) received a 2 year grant from the Wege Foundation. The grant focused on three objectives, listed below along with the progress made toward each.

### **Community Outreach**

- A diverse group of stakeholders within the watershed have been identified, such as schools, neighborhood organizations, and environmental groups...and of course indivduals such as you!
- An outreach plan is being developed, including verifiable/measureable goals such as:
  - Creation and distribution of material such as brochures and bumper stickers
  - Meeting/activity participation
  - o Website usage

### Education

- Partnership with school classroom activities at Highland Park.
- Potential collaboration with local tech group to develop an online self-guided watershed tour.

### Stewardship

- Participation in stream clean-ups and invasive species removal along the creek banks.
- Beginning to obtain tools and skills necessary for citizen scientists to collect creek data.
- Engaged in promoting and taking part in adopting storm drains.



## Sacred Grounds

LGROW and the Coldbrook Creek Community are coordinating with Sacred Grounds to offer an informational session this spring within our watershed (date and location TBD...watch for more info soon!).

The National Wildlife Federation's <u>Sacred</u> <u>Grounds</u> program recognizes congregations, houses of worship, and faith communities who create wildlife habitat, actively link faith practices and caring for the environment, and disseminate these practices throughout the community. They have funding (\$1500 minigrants) and technical support available for 8 faith communities interested in participating in the program. In this program Houses of Worship would have the opportunity to create a native plant garden on their grounds.
